Discovery Of Aborigines' Religious Mound

A discovery was made about three miles from Brunswick Heads recently of an aborigines' religious mound, which is believed to have been the centre of worship of natives from all parts of Australia before the coming of the white race. The mound is 35 feet in length and 15 feet in height access to it being gained by a sloping pathway on one side. It appears to have been untouched for a great many years. Mr. Frederick Sinter, President of the Archaeological Society of Australia, has deciphered many of the carvings on the sandstone, which must have been orought a considerable distance. There is none of it in the district.

It is believed that three religious mounds are known to be in existence, namely, in Scotland, America, and the Northern Territory. A Praser Island aborigine, when told of the discovery, said that his tribe had been searching for the mound for years.
